OPENING CEREMONY KICKS OFF SPRING AND HONORS GIFT OF TREES WITH WORLD-CLASS TALENT FROM THE U.S. AND JAPAN

Washington, DC [March 6, 2019] – The National Cherry Blossom Festival's signature <u>Opening</u> <u>Ceremony</u> will take place Saturday, March 23 at the Warner Theatre from 5-6:30 p.m. The event welcomes the nation's greatest springtime celebration and marks the annual commemoration of the 1912 gift of cherry blossom trees from Tokyo to Washington, DC. The friendship between the U.S. and Japan is celebrated through outstanding performances from acclaimed artists with ties to both countries; Festival leaders and dignitaries help narrate the ceremony, including a special moment of friendship between DC Mayor Muriel Bowser and the Ambassador of Japan, His Excellency Shinsuke Sugiyama. Free tickets have all been claimed, but the ceremony will be live-streamed on <u>Facebook</u>.

"Pretty Guardian Sailor Moon" The Super Live

The series, *Pretty Guardian Sailor Moon*, written by Naoko Takeuchi, debuted in *Nakayosi*, a leading girls' comic magazine published by Kodansha, in 1991. As a new type of performance based on this series, *"Pretty Guardian Sailor Moon" The Super Live* has clearly distinguished itself from a conventional musical. The full eighty-minute performance, with an overwhelming sense of speed, dance, images and special effects, premiered in Tokyo in August 2018 and again in Paris in November 2018, and was highly praised. The cast members of the show will make their **North American debut** at the National Cherry Blossom Festival's Opening Ceremony, where special selections from the show will be performed. This entirely new live performance is sure to captivate audiences around the world!

Ikuko Kawai Ensemble: Violinist and composer Ikuko Kawai will present an original interpretation of Japan's famous *The Tale of Genji*, accompanied by traditional Japanese instruments. *The Tale of Genji* was written in the eleventh century by a woman in the Japanese royal court, and is often called the world's first novel.

Yusaku Mochizuki (Mochi): With thrilling showmanship, Yusaku Mochizuki raises the bar of live performance, incorporating tap dance, video art, and LED diabolos into his shows. The 6821 Quintet: Created by The Ryuji Ueno Foundation as part of the Potomac Music-Lab Project, this classical ensemble was specially assembled for the National Cherry Blossom Festival and named to reflect the distance from Tokyo to Washington, D.C.
