Washington, DC [March 6, 2019] – The National Cherry Blossom Festival Parade® presented by Events DC will take place Saturday, April 13 from 10 a.m. to noon, rain or shine. One of the Festival's largest events, the Parade runs along Constitution Avenue from 7th to 17th Streets, NW. The Parade, hosted by ABC7/WJLA-TV anchors Michelle Marsh and Bill Kelly, will feature celebrity entertainment, helium balloons, characters, floats, marching bands, and other performers. Local ABC affiliate WJLA will air the Parade locally in a delayed telecast from noon to 2 p.m. and again from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. on cable channel WJLA 24/7 News. The Parade will be nationally syndicated to audiences across the country through the support of Events DC.
